

Information & FAQs

DRESS CODE

First and foremost: YOU MUST HAVE A CHS CAP/GOWN to participate in the graduation ceremony. Dress code is strictly enforced. You will be pulled from the line-up if you do not meet dress code requirements.

Guys: Collared dress shirt with tie/bowtie (borrow one, if necessary). Khaki or dark dress pants. NO jeans. Dress shoes or clean dressy boots. NO casual shoes such as tennis shoes, slides, sandals. etc.

Girls: Dress or dress pants. Neutral colored shoes with a back. NO casual shoes such as tennis shoes, slides, etc. Heels are highly discouraged, due to prolonged standing and tripping hazards on stairs and floor mat.

Graduation caps: Caps CANNOT be decorated. Please write your name on the inside of your cap so you can retrieve yours after the ceremonial toss. Do not toss caps with tassels still attached.

Only approved cords and stoles may be worn for graduation.

Honors regalia will be distributed by Counselors on May 9th. Cords for clubs/orgs will be distributed by individual sponsors at their convenience.

Graduation FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How many family/friends can I invite to Graduation?

There is no limit to the number of family/friends that can attend for you.

What about parking for Graduation?

Please plan on parking being an issue for Graduation. CHS Graduation draws a huge volume of attendees and parking spaces near The Hoop cannot accommodate everyone. Allow extra time for finding parking when arriving for Graduation practice and the ceremony. Carpooling is encouraged.

Can we celebrate in the student section?

We recognize your desire to celebrate the occasion with the throwing of beach balls and/or streamers. However, NO CELEBRATION CAN TAKE PLACE UNTIL THE LAST STUDENT HAS WALKED OFF THE STAGE; NO EXCEPTIONS. The following guidelines for celebrations are also in place for students AND auests:

- NO noise makers (including air horns, cow bells, etc)
- NO silly string
- NO glifter

Anything done to damage Tech's floor covering will result in a personal fine to the guilty party(ies).


Failure to abide by these guidelines may result in your diploma being pulled. Diplomas that are withheld can only be picked up at CHS on the Monday following Graduation.

How do I get my diploma?

Only diploma covers are given on stage during the ceremony. Line sponsors will distribute diplomas after the ceremony, behind guest seating sections inside the arena (not on the track). Administration and/or line sponsors can refuse diploma distribution for student misbehavior during the ceremony. Diplomas that are withheld can only be picked up at CHS on the Monday following Graduation.

POWERSCHOOL PARENT PORTAL LOGIN REQUEST

Cookeville Cavalier Parents / Guardians,

The PowerSchool Parent Portal is an easy-to-use web-based tool for parents and guardians that provides secure, near real time information about your child's grades, attendance, class schedule, demographic information, and more.

How to Create an Account

The first time, you must create an account using the school's assigned Access ID and Password from a letter sent home at the beginning of school. Your school can also help you with this information.

Things you will need to create your account:

- District Code BQHG is the 4-digit code for Putnam County School System
- The secure access ID Access this ID comes in a letter from their school within the first nine weeks or parents/caregivers can contact the school.

Get started by clicking the log-in page. *Tutorial videos are also available on the log-in page.

I have an account, what is next?

Once you have created a login, use your User ID and Password when you log in each time.

How To Add Student and 5 Enrollment forms for new students.

Setting Up Automatic Reminders:

- 1. Once you log in, choose Email Notifications on the left.
- 2. Click each box with the information you would like to receive, how often and to what email address.
 - 3. Click submit.

PowerSchool Mobile App

- 1. Install App (Apple or Android)
- 2. Enter District Code BQHG is the 4-digit code for Putnam County School System3. Login using the Student or Parent username and password.

Troubleshooting:

Having issues logging in? It may be that your email is already tied to a PowerSchool account.

Please contact your school to have your password reset.

Mobile App: If parents/caregivers are having issues with the mobile app (seeing last year's info, etc.), they need to delete the app and reinstall it. The old app is being directed to the old URL so a reinstall should fix the problem.
